BRIGHTON BALLET THEATER SCHOLARSHIP INFORMATION

GENERAL INFORMATION

The goal of our scholarship program is to ensure that all students, regardless of their economic ability are given the chance to study dance in a professional school. BBT offers several scholarship programs to BBT students based on merit and/ or financial need, including special programs for Teen and Boys. Please see below for a complete description of each program.

ELIGIBILITY

In order to be considered for a BBT scholarship, applicants must meet the following criteria:

- 1. Be a registered students at BBT; and
- 2. Demonstrate proficiency and above average commitment and passion for dance; and
- 3. Attend all scheduled classes; and
- 4. Participate in all BBT performance during the school term (September- June);
- 5. Abide by the specific program rules for the scholarship program; and
- 6. Abide by BBT's General Rules and Policies.

SELECTION PROCESS

All decisions to award scholarships are made by BBT's Scholarship Committee, which meets several times a year. Decisions to award scholarships are made at the sole discretion of BBT's Scholarship Committee based on a child's ability, financial need, funding availability and other criteria determined by the Scholarship Committee. BBT's Committee reserves the right not to award scholarships if, in the opinion of the Committee none of the applicants meet the qualifications.

DESCRIPTION OF BBT SCHOLARSHIPS

Financial Based Scholarship:

Students ages 2-18 years old are eligible for partial or full financial based scholarships. BBT is committed to ensuring that every child who wants to dance is given the opportunity to dance and we make every effort to give students partial or full scholarships. If a student is selected for this scholarship they must agree to attend all scheduled classes and participate in all school-term BBT performances.

Merit Based Scholarship:

Students ages 7-18 are eligible for a merit based partial or full scholarship for the advanced division. Students must undergo an audition to be considered for this scholarship. If a student is selected for this scholarship they must agree to <u>attend all scheduled classes and participate</u> in all school-term BBT performances (September - June).

Boys Fitness & Dance Program:

This program is for boys ages 8-18 years old based on a merit and financial need who have a desire to dance and stay fit. To be a part of this program students must agree to attend classes three times per week and participate in BBT's school-term performances (September-June). This program is sponsored by a grant from the Brooklyn Community Foundation.

After-School Teen Program:

This program is for selected students ages 13-18 years old who are in the advanced division. Students in this program are given pre-professional training with a special attention on preparing students for performing on stage in BBT's productions and exposing them to other professions within the arts. In order to be eligible for this program students must take <u>3 after-school dance classes</u> (Monday-Friday; classes on weekend days are not subsidized by this program) and <u>must participate in all school-term BBT performances (September-June)</u>. In addition, students must also commit to do between 6-10 hours of work-study hours in a selected area of interest. Participants can choose which area of work-study they would like to do and will receive training. Currently BBT offers the following work-study areas:

- Dance instruction;
- Fundraising and event planning;
- Office administration;
- · Costume design.

This program is funded in part by the New York City Department of Cultural Affairs and the New York City Department of Youth and Community Development.
